*ELED 4420 requires admission to student teaching through the Office of Field Experience. Admission requirements: completed application, advisor approval, completion of all program requirements, grade of C or better in ALL Professional Education Courses and a GPA of at least 2.75 in those same courses.

**Students shall be dropped from a course if they register out of sequence.

Licensure Testing Information

Current legislation requires that all teachers seeking Elementary Education licensure in North Carolina must pass the NC Foundations of Reading and General Curriculum (Math and Multi-subject subtests) licensure tests. To prepare for this requirement, students at the University of North Carolina at Charlotte enrolled in the Elementary Education program must take a *practice version* of the General Curriculum prior to being admitted to the major. The practice test is available on Canvas. Practice tests will be scored, and students will receive a recommendation (based on their performance) to either take the *official* General Curriculum or to participate in additional test preparation.

It is strongly recommended that students take the *official* NC Foundations of Reading and General Curriculum prior to the start of their student teaching semester. Passing scores are as follows: Reading (229), Math subtest (227), Multi-subject subtest (227)

Note: The requirement to take the *practice version* of the General Curriculum prior to being admitted to the Elementary Education major is in addition to the requirement to take and pass the Praxis Core (or be exempt via SAT or ACT scores).
